

# Communications in Soil Science and Plant Analysis

## Instructions for Authors

**Aims and Scopes:** This journal provides rapid publication of articles on soil science and crop production, particularly in the areas of mineral content of soil and plants and of plant nutrition.

**Manuscript Format:** All parts of the manuscript should be typewritten, double-spaced, with margins of one inch on all sides. Number manuscript pages consecutively throughout the paper. Avoid abbreviations, diagrams, and reference to the text within the abstract.

**Affiliation:** On the title page include full names of authors, academic and/or other professional affiliations and the complete mailing address with telephone number of the author to whom proofs and correspondence should be sent. Do not submit position titles.

**References:** Include only references to books, articles, and bulletins actually cited in the text. Cite references within the text by author and date (Smith, 1983) (Smith et al., 1983). Prepare a reference list in accordance with *The Chicago Manual of Style*, 15th Edition. Examples:

**Book Chapter:** Hsu, P. H. 1987. Aluminum hydroxides and oxyhydroxides. In *Minerals in soil environments*, eds. J. B. Nixon and S. Weed, 99-143. Madison, Wisconsin: SSSA.

**Journal Article:** Tian, G., and G. O. Kolawole. 2004. Comparison of various plant residues as phosphate rock amendment on Savanna soils of West Africa. *Communications in Soil Science and Plant Analysis* 27: 571-583.

**Book:** New, T. R. 1991. *Insects as predators*. Kensington, Australia: New South Wales University Press.

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
